

Research Findings

More than 50% of Vancouverites anticipate that their sharing of physical objects and spaces will increase over the next 3-5 years.







81% BORROWING78% LENDING



1 out of every 3 people in Vancouver are interested in sharing more with their peers, with individuals 26-40 reporting the most interest of all age groups.



Factors That Affect Lending With Peers

Trust

86%

You know the borrower well

Convenience & Access

81%

75%

Lending will help build social relationships





Types of Sharing Models














Peer-to-Organization






Peer-2-Peer — Co-ordination




Peer-2-Peer – Responsibility




Peer-2-Peer – Ownership




