

INTEGRATED SOLID WASTE & RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PLAN



70% diversion by 2015

- 80% diversion by 2020
- 10% per capita waste reduction

Achieved:

61% diversion in 2014

KEEPING FOOD OUT OF OUR GARBAGE

About 1/3 of regional garbage in Metro Vancouver is compostable organics

Divert organics from disposal

Reduce landfill reliance Feed people or animals

Create compost and biofuel

Prevent landfill methane

More effective waste-to-energy process



ORGANICS DISPOSAL BAN CONSULTATION AND ENGAGEMENT



IMPLEMENTATION AND ENFORCEMENT

- Inspection at disposal sites
- Education period for 6 months
- 50% surcharge on tipping fee started July 1, 2015
- Surcharge loads with over 25% food waste
- Decrease allowable food waste limit over time



WHAT THE BAN INCLUDES

The Organics Disposal Ban includes all food and packaged food





FROM FOOD WASTE TO COMPOST

Private processing facilities in Metro Vancouver compost about 300,000 tonnes per year







FROM FOOD WASTE TO BIOFUEL

Organic waste anaerobically digested to produce methane gas










 broadcast media hits


July 1


ORGANICS PROCESSED INCREASING OVER TIME



- High Awareness of Organics Disposal Ban & Management
- 59% 81% of Businesses and MF Dwellings have Food Waste Recycling
- Small Proportion (12%)
 need Education on Food
 Waste Recycling



ENFORCEMENT LIMITATIONS

Metro Vancouver disposal bans can only be enforced at our facilities



WASTE BYPASSING REGIONAL FACILITIES

Some garbage haulers take loads to private landfills outside the Metro Vancouver system, where our disposal bans are not enforced, and the tipping fees do not pay for our regional costs.

SOURCE SEPARATION

Success of organics diversion program depends on:

- Markets for compost and recyclable materials
- Quality of compost and recyclable materials

- Early adopters built capacity in collection and processing systems


